GETTING ROSES READY FOR EXHIBITING

PLEASE LIST VARIETY IF NAME IS KNOWN

These tips and guidelines are offered only as suggestions in helping you determine how you will prepare your exhibit.

1. **WATERING** - Deep root water roses at least 2 weeks before cutting for a show. Continue to water as needed until the day of show. This will add size and lushness to your roses.
2. **FERTILIZING** - Feed roses at least every 4 to 6 weeks.
3. **PEST CONTROL** - Flowers & foliage should be free of insects & spiders. Forcefully spray roses with water in the morning to remove most insects.
4. **GROOMING FOR SHOW** -
 - a. Cut stem of rose at least 15 inches in length (try to have at least two sets of *five leaflets*). Plunge stems up to their necks in a bucket of hot (98 to 100) water and let them set for at least 10 minutes or longer. As you put them in cool water, cut the stem off again, *under water*, preventing any air pocket, allowing a flow of water to foliage & bloom.
 - b. Gently wipe the foliage with a piece of paper towel or a soft cloth to rid the foliage of dirt and other surface material. **DO NOT** use leaf polish. If leaves are damaged, trim them with a small pair of scissors. Try to retain the normal shape of the leaf. Rose petals also may be trimmed for irregularities in their shape.
 - c. Buds will not be judged. Roses should be 2/3 - 3/4 open.
5. If the weather should start to warm up (90 +) and roses are beginning to open, **CUT** as per instructions above, and store in a closet or dark cool area. The roses will hold for about 5 days. Remove them from the dark area on the day of exhibit delivery. Some roses hold better than others, some may be past their best exhibition stage.

SHOWING ROSE TYPES

HYBRID TEA

1 bloom per stem (NO side buds).

GRANDIFLORA

At least two or four flowers at the same stage of opening and nearly the same size.

FLORIBUNDA

Blooms may be at all stages: bud with color, ½ open, 3/4 open, or fully open. Must be three or more blooms.

RULES AND INFORMATION:

(Floriculture Gardens see next page)

1. Each exhibit must be accurately and correctly labeled under the proper class number, even though they are the same type of flower, for example: Two entries of a red rose must be listed separately and each must have a tag. **Please specify variety.** Exhibit will not be disqualified if variety is unknown.
2. Exhibits in the Floriculture Department, except arrangements and gardens, must have been grown by the exhibitor.
3. Exhibitors must have owned potted plants for at least six (6) months and African violets for three (3) months prior to Fair. Plants and arrangements must not be any larger or heavier than Exhibitor can handle. Plant & container larger than 3 feet in any direction is subject to approval by the Building Supervisor.
4. Container grown plants must be planted in suitable standard containers and adequately rooted. Oversized containers will not be permitted.
5. All flowers in the specimen classes must have their own foliage. No wiring, fillers, oiling, plant shine, or artificial color is permitted in horticulture classes. This does not apply to arrangements.
6. Containers are provided for the cut flower divisions.
7. All divisions are limited to residents of San Joaquin and its contiguous counties.
8. No entry will be accepted where an exhibitor prescribes conditions under which he or she will exhibit.
9. No exhibitor will receive more than two cash awards in any one class under the American Judging System. Ribbons will be awarded as placed. (See State Rules, Section IV, #6 Awards and Scoring.)
10. Exhibitors who have container plants that require special maintenance may request 4 admission/parking passes per family for plant maintenance.
11. All exhibits released Monday, June 21, 9:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. or as necessary.

NO ENTRY FEE - \$25.00 REFUNDABLE DEPOSIT

RULES AND INFORMATION:

1. LIMIT - TWO - 20 ft wide by 10 ft deep gardens per exhibitor per division, space limited, entries will be received on availability.
2. Members of a family are considered as one exhibitor and co-owners of exhibits. This includes mother, father, unmarried minor (under 18 years of age) children and minor foster children. In the Youth Divisions of the Floriculture Department, brothers and/or sisters are considered to be separate exhibitors.
3. Work on outdoor gardens may begin Saturday, June 12, 8:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. daily. Call Fair Office (209) 466-5041 to make arrangements.
4. Exhibits must be free standing. Do not nail to permanent walls.
5. Gardens must be completed by 8:00 a.m. Wednesday, June 16, and will be judged 9:00 a.m. Wednesday, June 16. **EXHIBITORS ARE ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND JUDGING.** Critique to follow judging.
6. The exhibitors name must be displayed on an 8" x 10" sign after judging has been completed.
7. Exhibitors are responsible for maintaining display in good condition for duration of the Fair, using their own gardening tools. All gardens with running water or motorized movement must be maintained for the duration of the Fair and kept in working condition, the same as they were on the day they were judged. Cash award monies may be withheld if gardens are not maintained throughout the fair. Awards & deposits will be released after gardens have been leveled to a smooth terrain.
8. Garden exhibitors may enter through the Fair office mornings from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. for maintaining garden area.
9. **A Landscape Plan is required for all gardens.**
10. Gardens are categorized as Professional or Amateur/Non-Professional/or Adult Organization.
Professional: One who is in any phase of landscape gardening or retail or wholesale nursery work.
Amateur: Open to clubs, organizations or individuals and limited to amateur/nonprofessionals.
11. **Guarantee Deposit** - A \$25 deposit will be required to secure garden area. Garden must be judged, disassembled, and cleared to receive deposit refund.

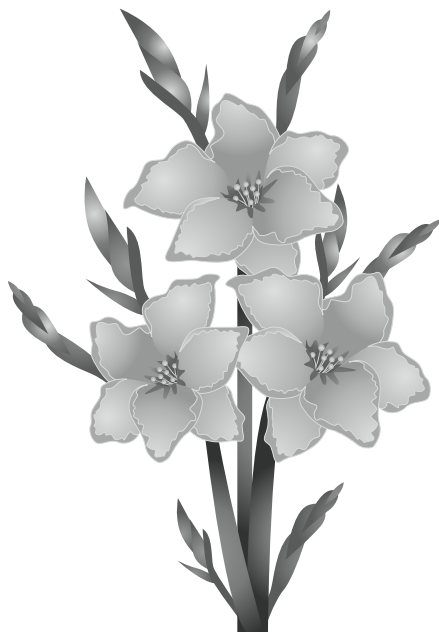

Flower arranging is the art of organizing design elements according to the principles of design to attain beauty, harmony, distinction and expression. Design principles govern flower arranging as they do all art forms. The difference between flower arranging and other arts is the use of plant material instead of paint, etc.

AMATEUR NOVICE - One who has never entered a flower show or has not won more than ten (10) blue ribbons.

AMATEUR INTERMEDIATE - One who has won ten (10) or more blue ribbons but not more than twenty-five (25).

MASTERS - Open to an exhibitor who has won at least twenty-five (25) blue ribbons. Also floral teachers, lecturers, judges, or anyone who has received remuneration for their services and has had flower show experience.

OPEN - To all arrangers.

ELEMENTS OF DESIGN - Are space, line, form, size, color, texture and pattern. These are the ingredients of the design you select from your garden, etc., bringing the ingredients into the design.

PRINCIPLES OF DESIGN - Design principles apply to all forms of art. These are balance, proportion, scale, rhythm, dominance and contrast. Fresh flowers and/or fresh plant material should be used in all arrangements unless stated otherwise. Foliage and accessories permitted unless otherwise noted. Succulents may be classed as foliage. No artificial fruits, vegetables or flowers allowed. Materials or exhibits entered in a given class will not be permitted to compete in any other class any other day. Exhibitor must freshen displays as often as necessary, as premiums will be withheld if exhibits are not maintained.

PICTURE BOX - 28" width X 16" depth X 26" height

PEDESTALS - Square top, approximately 18

ARRANGEMENTS
GROOMING CUT FLOWERS FOR SHOW ARRANGEMENTS

These tips and guidelines are offered only as suggestions in helping you determine how you will prepare your exhibit. Flowers need not be grown by exhibitor to qualify for use in arrangements. Purchased fresh flowers are acceptable in arrangements.

If you grow your own flowers, pick them in the cool of the day, preferably the evening before arranging when they can be left overnight in water. Cut flowers with stem in proportion to size of flower, (at least 5 times the size of the flower, if possible).

Make a second cut under water to allow a full flow of water absorption up the stem. Cut stems on a slant. Scrape off some bark at the bottom of the stem for woody-stemmed flowers and branches. Strip all foliage from the stem that will be below the water level when exhibited. Flowers absorb warm water more quickly than cold, use water at room temperature.
